#### Arrival instructions

#### Arriving by plane at CPH airport

From the airport the easiest way to get to Ridebanevej 3, 1870 Frederiksberg, is to catch the metro from the arrival terminal. It is pretty straight forward when you get there, but here are some instructions:


- When you arrive at CPH airport is to go to the arrival terminal (terminal 3) and just straight to the end (just follow the "Metro" signs). At the station you can buy tickets with either cash or credit card.

- You have to take the M2 line (Vanløse) and then jump off at Frederiksberg Station.

#### Arriving by train

- From the Copenhagen main station please find the M3 metro line to Frederiksberg station. You can buy tickets on the station with cash or card.

#### From Frederiksberg station:

From Frederiksberg Station, it's a 500-meter walk to Ridebanevej 3. Google Maps suggests a route via Hostrupvej, but you can also take a more scenic path through the green area with a playground alongside. Ensure you walk on the left side of the road and avoid the bicycle path on the right. Bicyclists in Copenhagen can be quite a challenge if you are not following the traffic rules and walk in their way:
